PROGRAMME OUTCOMES BENGALI HONOURS (CBCS)

- Bangla is the predominant contemporary Indian language in our nation. The majority of the population in East India speaks this language as their native tongue. Since its inception, Bengali literature and the Bengali language have been enhancing several genres. Consequently, the curriculum and syllabus for Bangla honours and general courses have been specifically crafted to enhance the prestige of the Bangla language and literature.
- From a historiographical standpoint, students will acquire knowledge of the chronicles of Bengali literature, encompassing its diverse epochs and spanning nearly a millennium. They will acquire comprehensive understanding of the roots and progressive evolution of Bengali language from the past to the present.
- Bengali literature in the modern era has exceptional novels, short tales, and poetry of global stature. Essays and various other genres of literature. This syllabus provides our undergraduate students with a comprehensive understanding of all facets of contemporary Bengali literature.
- This syllabus provides a comprehensive understanding of the fundamental principles and concepts in the fields of philology and linguistics, specifically in relation to the Bengali language. This program prioritizes the cultivation of a strong understanding of grammar among our students, enabling them to construct accurate sentences, words, and phrases, and effectively articulate their perspectives.
- This syllabus promotes the cultivation of creative writing skills and the development of autonomous thinking and original ideas among our pupils.
- This syllabus comprises discipline-specific elective courses and skill building courses. The DSE (Discipline Specific Elective Course) familiarizes our students with various aspects of Bengali literature, including children's literature, women's literature, science fiction, and more. The SEC (Skill Enhancement Course) teaches practical skills such as proofreading, text editing, and script writing. This course provides students with a straight pathway into their chosen professional field.

BENGALI GENERAL (B.A.) UNDER CBCS

- This curriculum enables students to acquire the skill of translating from English to Bengali. In addition, they develop proficiency in proofreading, composing official letters, reporting, managing diverse tasks, and more. Engaging in any of these approaches will enhance students' prospects of securing employment as translators, professional proof readers, or reporters in news agencies. Consequently, the course of study equips students with the necessary skills and expertise to excel in several professional domains.
- Acquire a comprehensive understanding of linguistics and the historical development of Bengali literature, spanning from ancient times to the medieval and modern eras. In order to fully comprehend poetry, it is essential for the students to have a solid grasp of the basic principles of Bengali rhythms and rhetorics. In addition, they get knowledge of "Baishanab Padabali', 'Ramayan', and 'Annadamangal'.
- Students are empowered to transfer and use the taught concepts and principles to analyse several branches of Bengali literature, including fiction, short stories, essays, and poetry. Comprehend the fundamental concepts and practical uses of categorizing drama, novels, and poetry.
- Formulate a conceptual understanding of aesthetic perception and comprehend the multidisciplinary methodology.

LCC (2) UNDER CBCS

- Students in the fourth and sixth semesters have the option to select two courses, each worth 12 credits, at the Modern Indian Language Learning level. These courses can be chosen from any of the courses available in the undergraduate general category.
- Given that those who have enrolled in Bengali as a subject are eligible to study it, two language papers have been designated for the sixth and fourth semesters.
- The fourth semester of the undergraduate general department focuses on developing a fundamental comprehension of language and literature. This is achieved through the study of many aspects of Bengali linguistics literature, as well as the reading of poems by Madhusudan Dutt. The subject of Bengali linguistics is covered in the first module of the fourth semester.

- Through the examination of this paper, students will acquire an understanding of the patterns and characteristics of semantic shifts in the Bengali language. This knowledge will subsequently prove beneficial to them in their professional endeavours.
- In the sixth semester, students will get an understanding of the significance of Bengali journals in disseminating current Bengali ideas, as well as have the opportunity to appreciate novels and short tales.
- In addition to acquiring linguistic proficiency, these two courses also aid the journey towards self-expression and empowerment.
