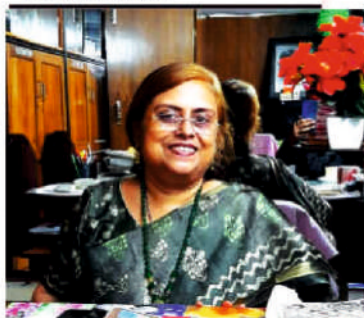

Inspiring girls to excel

A women's college, which mentions its mission is to provide women education during separate hours and separate infrastructure and ensure and sustain quality in education, is trying to make its mark in the city.

Maharani Kasiswari College, in north Kolkata, affiliated with Calcutta University, offers various degree courses and shares its space with two other colleges, Maharaja Manindra Chandra College (day college) and Maharaja Sris Chandra College (evening college).

This college came into existence in 1964 after directions from the UGC, when Manindra Chandra College was split up into three units: Morning, Day and Evening, with separate affiliations under CU. The Morning section, meant exclusively for girl students, started functioning from 2 December 1964, and was named after Maharani Kasiswari, in memory of Maharani Kasiswari, who once entered this house as a 7-year-old bride. The genesis of the college dates back to 1 October 1947, when the Manindra Chandra College morning came into being.

But the college faced a space crunch as the years passed by and the college started growing in strength. The principal of the college, Prof. Sima Chakrabarti, said she had to think wisely to create more space out of the existing one, which was a challenge. "After I joined, the most acute problem that I saw the college faced, was space. The space is being shared by three colleges. I was constantly looking to add space for more classes and for the staff. Fortunately, Kasiswari College had a separate building for itself. The space was small, but I started adding up space with modifications to rooms and other vacant spaces. The college had a couple of floors and two rooms on the roof, which were temporary structures. I made them permanent and also expanded the space above. As a result, the college now has three floors. We also have a cooking laboratory for the food and nutrition classes. The college

boasts a gymnasium within the campus. We have also managed to carve out space for an auditorium too," said Prof. Chakrabarti, who got her PhD from the Indian Association for the Cultivation of Science in Jadavpur.

The website of Maharani Kasiswari College enlists its vision as to serve the nation by producing a continuous flow of mentally and physically self-reliant, empowered, unprejudiced and socially committed 'efficacious human resources' who would be capable of facing any challenge in the context of rapid global changes.

Accredited by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), the college offers undergraduate courses in science, arts and commerce.

Prof. Chakrabarti joined the college as principal in 2008. Before taking over the responsibility of the college, she was working as a professor at Krishnath College Berhampur, where she worked for seven years, since 2001.

Listing her career graph, Prof. Chakrabarti said she had been to the Weizmann Institute of Science in Israel for research and also had joined the Saha Institute of Nuclear Physics as a research associate.

Now, the principal, apart from doing her administrative job, also takes classes and conducts examinations in physics.

The principal, after joining, started some of the subjects in the college after getting affiliation from Calcutta University, like geography, psychology, library science and computer science (Hons).

The college offers tourism and travel management, which includes a tour guide programme, as an add-on course.

Maharani Kasiswari College also holds regular job fairs, which are organised by the career development committee of the college. Every year, eager students appear for it and get jobs.

The college has also managed to implement the National Education Policy (NEP 2020). "We are managing well. We are distributing subjects amongst teachers and departments. NEP is very flexible, and it is not restricted to one department. There is collaboration between other colleges for subjects, and the students love the experience of collaboration. NEP is excellent for job preparation, too. NEP also has excellent scope for students to have internships. We do not face a space crunch and can continue our classes after the morning hours by virtue of a separate building for us. Arts and commerce classes start at 6.30 a.m. and go on until 12.30 p.m. For science, it starts at 8.30 a.m. and continues till 2.30 a.m.," said the principal.

Today, the college has grown manifold. With just two computers in 2008, the college now has over 60 computers.

Earlier, the college did not have its own library and had to share it with the other two colleges. Now, the college not only has a separate library, it is quite big, and it also has computer support for the students. The added advantage of the library is its separate reading rooms. With the state government starting a centralised admission portal, the college is prepared to go live. "I want to see it function. We are going to experience it for the first time. It is a good move, but in the initial days, it will be a challenge for us. We have also put out videos on the portal about the college. Right now, we are busy with the self-study report, preparing it for the UGC," said the principal.

The college and its principal take great care in its development in the sporting arena. The college has also engaged a sports teacher for the students. "Our students are very good at sports. They secured nine gold medals out of 10 events they took part in in the inter-college competition under the CU recently," said Prof. Chakrabarti.

Though the women's college does not have a playground, the students practise at Shyam Park and Children's Park, both within 150 metres of the college.

"We also plan to have a women's football team, which has huge potential and a future. Last year, we announced the formation of our team, but we got resistance from the parents. We also have regular yoga and self-defence classes. Our NCC unit is also very strong and does a lot of activities," said Prof. Chakrabarti.

The college has signed an MoU with Baghbazar Women's College and engages in teacher and student exchange programmes.

Students of the college celebrated World Environment Day on 5 June by planting trees. "We celebrate other days too by planting saplings of trees. We also created slogans against the cutting of trees to generate awareness, informed its principal.

The college posts inspirational write-ups on its websites to motivate the students.

At the college, there are many girls who come from financially deprived families, and the principal says she has been inspiring them to carry on with their studies despite hurdles. "I try to do something for them by waving off some of their fees under provisions or inspiring them to continue their studies," said Prof. Chakrabarti.

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HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

This college building at 20, **Maharani Kasiswari Nandy** Ramkanto Bose Street, Shyambazar, was an ancestral property of Maharaja Manindra Nandy. He was born on 29th May, 1860 in this house, and was married to Maharani Kasiswari of Burdwan when he was seventeen and the bride was only seven. In 1897, Manindra Chandra left Kolkata for Cossimbazar Estate.

Following the demise of Manindra Chandra, Maharaja Sris Chandra donated their house for setting up of a College in the said premises. The mission was made possible through immense initiative of some spirited persons of North Kolkata at that time. On 15 July, 1941 Maharaja Manindra Chandra College was established.

From 1st October 1947, a morning section of the College was opened to meet the educational aspirations of the neighbourhood girls. Maharani Kasiswari College came into existence when in 1964, according to the direction of UGC, Manindra Chandra College was split up into three units – Morning, Day and Evening, with separate affiliations under the University of Calcutta. The Morning section, meant exclusively for girl students, started functioning from 2nd December 1964 and was named as Maharani Kasiswari College, to perpetuate the memory of Maharani Kasiswari, who once entered this house as a 7-year-old bride. Since its inception, the college believes in the thought that Education Empowers Women – psychologically, economically, politically and socially at the level of Family, Community, Society, be it National and International.

ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Affiliation: The college is affiliated to University of Calcutta.

As a frontline educational institution, the college can become a knowledge hub based on the idea of sharing, storing, preserving various form of cognitive insight.

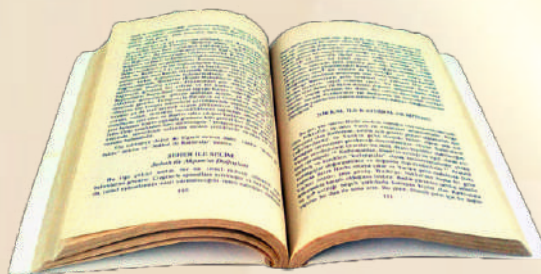

ATTENDANCE

On the basis of the Guideline Provided by the University of Calcutta

Requisite Attendance:

- (I) A Student attending at least 75% of the total number of classes held shall be allowed to appear at the concerned Semester End Examination subject to fulfilment of other conditions laid down in the regulations.
- (ii) A Student attending at least 60% but less than 75% of the total number of classes* held shall be allowed to appear at the concerned Semester End Examinations subject to the payment of prescribed condonation fees and fulfilment of other conditions laid down in the regulations.
- (iii) A Student attending less than 60% of the total number of classes held shall not be allowed to appear at the concerned Semester End Examinations. Such attendance will be calculated from the date of commencement of classes or the date of admission, whichever is later. Calculation of attendance percentage shall include all the courses offered in the concerned semester.



RULES & DISCIPLINE

- Students should not resort to hooliganism of any kind while on campus or outside it.
- Unnecessary and excessive use of mobile phones or any other electronic device while on campus, be it in gym or common rooms, should be avoided.

FACILITIES

- **IDENTITY CARD :**

Each Student is provided with an I-Card. This card is to be carried always. If it is lost, it must be informed to the office immediately. A new card may be issued on payment of fees. In case of transfer from the college, student must return the card to the college office.

- **CULTURAL COMPETITION :**

Every year cultural and literary competitions among the students are arranged in the College. All Students are encouraged to participate in competition. There are cultural and academic prizes for the students. . Students thus get opportunity to reveal their extra-curricular talents

- **LABORATORY :**

College provides well equipped laboratories - for Computer Science and IT, Food & Nutrition, Geography and Psychology courses.

- **MODERN TEACHING AIDS :**

College provides audiovisual aids like OHP, LCD projector etc. in the class rooms for easy and better understanding of the subject by the students.

- **SEMINARS, EXTENSION LECTURES AND WORKSHOPS :**

Seminars are organized by different Departments regularly in the college with active participation of teachers and students. Arrangements are made for extension lectures in different subjects by eminent scholars. Workshops are arranged as part of placement counselling of students.

- **SPORTS & GAMES :**

Every year annual outdoor sports of the college is held and prizes are awarded. College encourages its students to participate in several state-level competitions, inter-college and inter-University Tournaments and National Games.

- **COLLEGE MAGAZINE :**

The college publishes yearly magazine on a regular basis under the editorship of teachers which helps in creating habit among students in expressing their views on various aspect in open mind. Academic Journals are published incorporating teachers research-oriented articles. An editorial committee is there for the purpose.

- **OFFICE :**

The College has a computerized office. Students' personal data, their individual results, examination schedule etc. are stored and conveyed to students when necessary. Records of students' fee collection, daily accounts and various other important college records are maintained with care by efficient staff. Office staff are accessible and co-operate with the students. Students can approach them for any academic issue and help.

- **ALUMNI ASSOCIATION :**

The College Alumni Association (Registered No: S/IL/29693 of 2005-06) was formed in the year 2005. Its objective is to make co-ordination with the students who graduated from this institution in the past. Seminars, picnics and various cultural programmes are organised by this association.

- **EXCURSIONS :**

- Annual Excursion for students are organized by the college authorities. Departmental excursions are also arranged regularly.

- **STUDENTS' CAREER DEVELOPMENT AND PLACEMENT COUNSELLING:**

There is an arrangement for career development and placement of students through Students' Career Development and Placement Counselling Committee. There is regular display of information about seminars, workshops, employment opportunities on college notice board. Seminars, workshops and campus drives are arranged by reputed professional organizations like ICA, NUT, Aptec, Globsyn Business School, Dreamzone, Amazon, Tibet Tours and Travels, Avisari Holidays, Wheels and Wings, Pathfinder, ICICI Foundation, International School of Design etc. to provide knowledge about various career opportunities and to increase interview facing skills of students. Another add-on advantage for students is the availability of the books, newspapers, magazines and study materials to get prepared for different competitive examinations of the Central Govt, and the State Govt. This college has a tie up with WEBEL Technology Ltd. (A Govt, of West Bengal Undertaking) to provide computer literacy and training programme for the college students. From July 2018 to June 2024, nearly 100 students of the college have been placed in different sectors/organisations. More organisations are also collaborating with the CDPC for placement drive. A MOU has been signed with Frankfinn Institute. More organisations have come forward for campus drive : National Vocational Academy of India, JIS, Frankfinn Institute of Aviation, PIBM.

- **COMMON ROOM :**

The college has spacious common rooms for students. A number of journals, newspapers are subscribed to so that the rooms become space for studying as well as recreation. There are arrangements for various indoor games like table tennis, carrom, etc.

- **CANTEEN :**

The college authority has accommodated a canteen in the main building which supplies a variety of food at reasonable rates for the staff and the students.

- **GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL :**

The college has a Grievance Redressal Cell to look into grievances of the students regarding college administration, infrastructure, teaching-learning etc.

- **ANTI-RAGGING COMMITTEE & ANTI-RAGGING SQUAD:**

Our College has Anti-Ragging Committee and Anti-Ragging Squad on and from 6th July, 2007 for complying with the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India on measures against Ragging in educational institutions. Students are directed to contact the committee members for immediate reporting of any case of ragging within the college premises.

- **SANITARY NAPKIN VENDING MACHINE:**

Sanitary Napkin Vending machines have been installed in the college premise so that students have easy access to resources for menstrual hygiene.

- **SEXUAL HARASSMENT REDRESSAL CELL:**

In our college there is a 'Sexual Harassment Redressal Cell' on and from July 8, 2005. It comprises a few teacher members who are accessible and sensitive to students. Students may come to of avail of any type of help regarding any sexual harassment within the college campus. As per U.G.C. guidelines of 2013, an Internal Complaints Committee has been set up in the college for prohibition, prevention and redressal of sexual harassment.

- **ADORN COURSES :**

The College is arranging for a training of all students through **Adorn Courses** on English, Mathematics, GI, GK to prepare them to get Government Services. Each course will be of a duration of 4 months. For each course the course fee is Rs. 1800 and admission fee is Rs. 100. But students will have to pay Rs. 900 only in total as the college will share a part as scholarship to each student joining the course.

- **LIBRARY :**

The College has well-stocked libraries with spacious Reading Room attached to those. The college has two libraries-

1. Central Library (for Literature and Arts books)
2. GYANDHARA (for Science and Commerce books)



Students may borrow books from the library without any charge or deposit for use in the Reading Room during college hours; but they must not remove these books from the Library and must return them on the same day, failing which they will be fined for the extra days. Books borrowed for home study must be returned within 14 days. Students failing to do so are liable to be fined and no book will be issued to them again without the permission of the librarian. Honours students are permitted to borrow three volumes and general students can borrow two volumes at a time and retain them for a period not exceeding 14 days. Reference books, textbooks and rare books are not issued to them and if any volume is lost or damaged while in possession of the borrower, it will have to be replaced at the student's expense. Library cards which entitle holders to use the library are not transferable. A fee will be charged for a duplicate card if the original card is lost. All students have open access to library book stack.

- **Library Collections :**

The library has approximately 31,000 volumes and subscribes to more than 15 journals and periodicals to cater to various academic needs of the users. Library also subscribes to NLIST programme through which users are given access to more than 5000 e-journals and more than 3 lakhs e-books. The library also provides DELNET services for inter-library loan.

- **GENERAL LENDING RULES:**

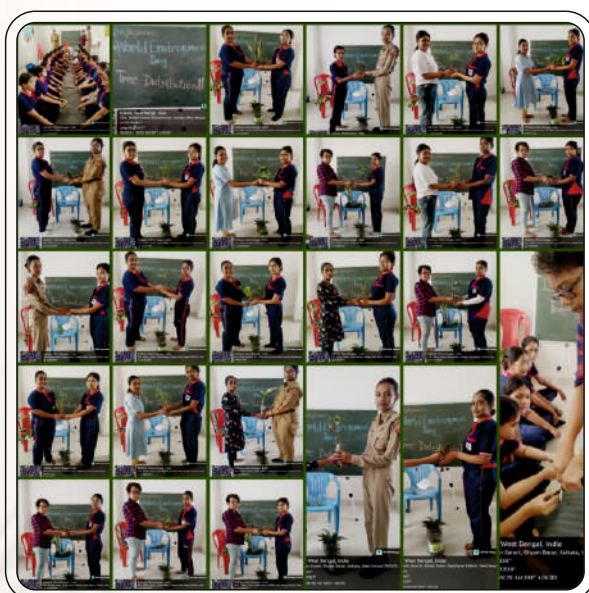
1. Users must produce their valid library card when borrowing the books. Users must check to see that all library materials in their possession have been properly checked out before leaving the library.
2. Users will be held responsible for any mutilation (including defacement) found in library materials when returned. Users must report the loss of library materials immediately to the concerned personnel of the Library.
3. Each student must mark attendance after entering into the library. Usage of mobile is strictly prohibited in library premises.
4. Users must ensure that the books issued to them are returned or renewed on or before the date due. Renewal is permitted for twice only after returning the same. Rs. 1/- per day for each book would be fined after due date.

- **SEMINAR LIBRARY :**

Each Department maintains a seminar library, an additional facility for the Honours students to borrow books.

- **NSS BOOK BANK :**

Under the supervision of NSS a second independent Book Bank Unit is run, formed by regular contribution from faculty members. This facility has been extremely useful for the students of the college as this is an additional source (apart from the Central Library) of books for poor students, for the entire academic year

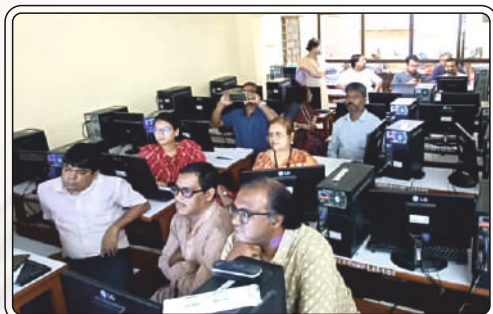


- **IQAC :**

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) is instrumental in making necessary recommendations for the all-round growth and quality control of the human resources as well as material resources available in the domain of the college. The IQAC monitors overall academic ambience, quality in teaching-learning and needs of the students. As per the guidelines of the UGC and NAAC, IQAC was formed in the year 2011 in Maharani Kasiswari College. The Cell comprises of the Principal, senior faculty members, external members, non-teaching staff and student representatives. This cell is active in providing support to the college in various ways with regard to quality maintenance.



1. This Cell collects feedbacks from the final year students of the college. The reports are analysed and issues evolved thereof are placed before the Principal, the Teachers' Council and also the concerned departments.
- II. IQAC collects self appraisal from the teachers which are taken to the Principal for annual assessment.
- III. This cell prepares the Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) for submission to NAAC.
- IV. IQAC monitors the research activities of the teachers and keeps records for future analysis.
- V. The cell collaborates with departments to organise seminars, webinars, workshops.
