Career paths include roles in research, education and positions involved in addressing the intersection of religion and various social issues.

<u>CC7 SOCIOLOGY OF GENDER AND SEXUALITY</u>- The objective of this study is to gain an understanding of the social construction of sexuality and gender. The student will be able to develop analytical skills through the use of this paper, which will allow them to investigate how societal norms shape identities, relationships, and power dynamics. It is possible that this programme will increase understanding of a variety of opinions and concerns which are associated with LGBTQ rights and gender equality. Professions that focus on fostering inclusivity and knowledge of gender and sexuality in a variety of settings and employment in research, activism, teaching, and policymaking are some of the possible career paths.

This paper helps the students to develop critical thinking skills to analyse and apply various theoretical perspective to social reality. Career paths may include roles in academia, research or positions where a deep understanding of social reality, social world is valuable.

<u>CC12 RESEARCH METHODS I</u>- This paper aims to acquaint the learners with the scientific ways of studying society. The purpose is to equip the students with research insights, which enable them to gather and obtain data by using various methods in an objective manner. Career paths include roles in academia, market research, social policy analysis or any profession requiring strong research skills.

<u>DSEB1 INDIAN SOCIOLOGICAL TRADITIONS</u>- This paper offers the students with a deep understanding of the unique Sociological theories, perspectives and methodologies rooted in the Indian context. Career paths may include roles in academia, research, social policy analysis or positions requiring a nuanced understanding of social dynamics in the Indian context.

SEM 6:

<u>DSEA4 AGRARIAN SOCIOLOGY</u>- This paper aims to equip the students with a better understanding of the distinct features of rural society, the dynamics and challenges associated with it. Career paths include roles in agricultural extension, rural development, policy analysis and research focused on addressing social issues related to rural society.

<u>DSEB3 SOCIOLOGY OF HEALTH AND MEDICINE</u>- This paper enables the students to understand the complex relationship between health and society. The students gain analytical skills to examine health disparities, medical institutions and the impact of social factors on well-being. This paper prepares the learners for careers in healthcare policy, medical counselling, public health research and in positions where understanding of the sociocultural aspects of health and medicine is essential.
